FAQ

What is a Worker Council?

A Worker Council is a representative forum of up to 20 members designed to provide workers from a particular enterprise or company with a voice to influence, guide and inform the Union's actions and decisions within their enterprise or company.

What will the Worker Council look like?

Each Council will be different.

Factors that are taken into consideration when developing a Worker Council are:

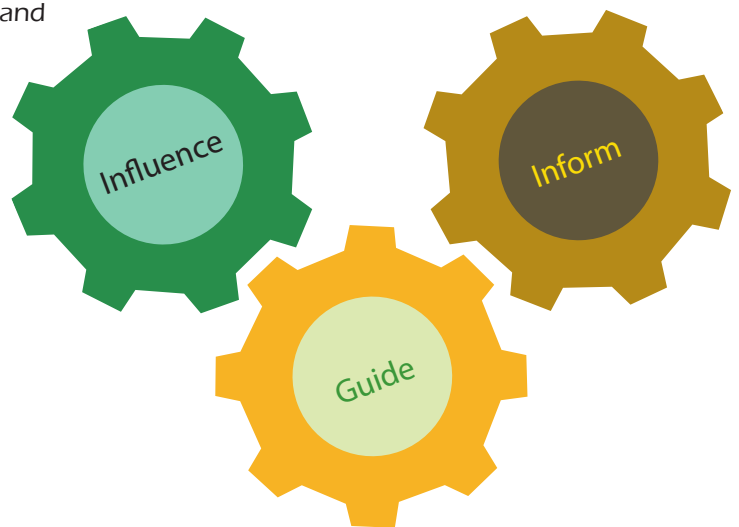
- the number of states/territories where the enterprise/company is located
- the number of enterprises within a company
- the composition of the workforce within the enterprise/company
- whether the Council is to be permanent or temporary
- the purpose for which the Council is being formed

Who is eligible to be on a Worker Council?

All financial members of the FSU from within the particular enterprise or company are eligible to be on the Council.

How will the members of the Worker Council be selected?

The FSU will call for expressions of interest from financial members within the enterprise or company that is to be represented by the Council.



How and when will a Worker Council meet?

Meetings will take place as agreed by the Council depending on the current activities and need to meet.

A meeting may be conducted via teleconference, videoconference, in person or however agreed by the Council.

Will the Worker Council receive training and support from the FSU?

Yes, training and ongoing support will be provided.
